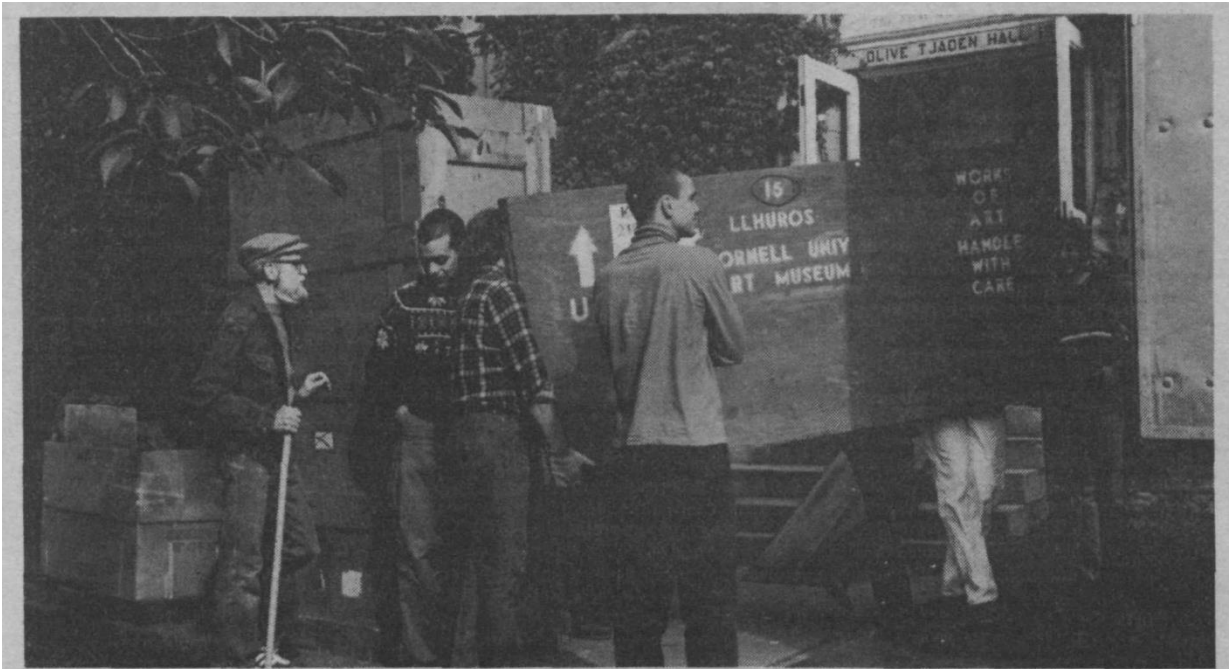


## *After Seven Years, Llhuros Returns from Germany*

Artifacts created by Daly for his imaginary lost civilization of Llhuros, as he often describes it, were the center piece of "Projekt '74", the international art exhibition of 1974 in Cologne, West Germany. The show toured museums throughout Germany but for the past several years has been lost again, this time in bureaucratic redtape, Daly says. The presentation was first shown in the United States in 1972 in the former Andrew D. White Museum on campus. It then toured seven museums in this country before being sent to Germany. Daly says arrangements are under way for additional showings in this country, with the monumental items he added to the collection for the German exhibitions and as yet never seen in this country.

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
